Meeting at Globecom 2011, Houston, TX

Thursday 8 December 2011
7:00 – 8:30 am
Hilton Americas Hotel.

1. Welcome and Introduction

The Chair, Abbas Jamalipour, of CSR TC opened the TC meeting at 7:00 am and asked for any changes or addition to the proposed agenda. The agenda was approved as proposed by the Chair. 33 members attended the meeting. The list of participants is included at the end of the minutes.

2. Approval of minutes from ICC 2011 in Kyoto, Japan

The draft minutes from ICC 2011 was presented to the meeting. The minutes were unanimously approved without any changes as the correct record of the TC meeting in ICC 2011.

3. Report from the Chair

TAC Report:

- i. The window for selection of papers awards have been increased from one to three years.
- ii. Total of 83 nominations were received for elevation to Fellow grade of which 33 were elected.
- iii. Recertification of 22 technical committees has been completed in 2010, and one will be done in 2011.
- iv. 28 nominations for Distinguished Lecturer were received in 2011. Deadline for DL nominations is end of August.
- v. There are 32 portfolio conferences and 67 technically cosponsored (sponsorship granted by technical committees) conferences, making a total of 99 conferences which are sponsored/technically cosponsored by ComSoc. Technical co-sponsorship allows papers to be included in IEEE Xplore.
- vi. There is a new subcommittee for Green Communications (GreenCom) and an ad hoc committee on Cloud Computing. IEEE Greencom was the first Comsoc conference using Webex. 70 people attended the conference which was based

on audio and Powerpoint. It was a single track conference with a registration fee of \$150.

4. TC Elections

- a. There were four positions for CSR TC elections. Larry Xue and Mohammed Atiquzzaman were unanimously elected as Chair and Vice Chair, respectively. Among the two candidates, Abdehhamed Mellouk was elected as Secretary. Hussein Mouftah has been elected as the Workshop and Conference chair.
- b. Henry Sutton has been reappointed as the Standardization Liaison.

5. Report from the Standardization Liaison:

- a. Nano networking is an upcoming topic in the area of communications. Research in this area may lead to new standards.
- b. Voting privileges in the standards board is being revised. Issues include whether TC liaison to standardization board can vote.

6. Reports on Conferences and Workshops

- a. HPSR'11 was held in Catagena, Spain. 135 papers were submitted of which 44 were accepted.
- b. HPSR'12 will be in Belgrade. Submission deadline is Jan 12 with acceptance notification on Mar 20.
- c. HPSR'13 will be in Taipei, Taiwan.
- d. Kohei Shiimoto made a presentation on World Telecommunications Congress 2012 to be held on Mar 5-6, 2012 in Miyazaki, Japan. There will be an number of invited speakers in the conference. There were 70 submissions with 41 accepted with 43% from academia and 57 from industry.
- e. CSR TC cosponsors NGN, Optical Networks and Wireless Networks symposiums at ICC and Globecom. The CSR representatives to those symposiums are:
